# The new CCC Local Development Plan (for 2040) is here BUT it *is only a draft!*

We need to raise our Peoples Voices once more (by June 3<sup>rd</sup>!) and supporting the CCC's new housing policy making sure the final version is right for Adisham!

# What shall I say to keep Adisham New Town out of any future plan?

If you responded to the last plan consultation, you don't need to make your detailed arguments again. However all the previous reasons against an 'Adisham New Town' remain! These need RESTATING in your response. We need to:

- Defend Adisham as a separate rural community.
- Protect our beautiful downland landscape
- Keep this highly productive, prime farmland
- Control road traffic
- East Kent is already a water stressed area
- Already inadequate our Sewage infrastructure
- No to light pollution, air pollution, noise pollution
- Conserve our wildlife habitats
- Support the CCC's New Housing Strategy

### REMEMBER: if the developers have their way, this scheme will be served up to us again!

# What shall I say about new houses on Station Road?

The new Draft Plan includes proposal for about 10 new houses along Station Road opposite the existing housing (Policy R12).

Some things to consider:

- Would Adisham benefit from new housing?
- Should there be 'starter homes'?
- Should this land be developed?
- What about access onto Station Road?
- How can we calm traffic along Station Road? And what about parking?

### What shall I say about huge industrialtype sprawl on nearby farmland?

The new Draft Plan includes proposal for vast factory-type warehousing at Highland Court (called 'canterbury business park' -Policy C17).

You might have concerns such as:

- An increase in traffic on already busy Cold Harbour Lane and more traffic through our village.
- Increased noise and more light pollution
- A scheme to build on precious Kent Downs National Landscape (why not use the vacant brownfield nearby?)
